Release description

The ability for users of the Apply for a Property and Affairs Deputyship Order digital form, to save and return to their application.

When an application is being made by a user they now have the ability to save their application at any stage. This will send a onetime use link to the user's email address. Everytime the user accesses their application they will need to re save it.

The user can select the 'save for later' button which will display as below;



How this works

When the user_selects save for later this will display the following screen, they
will be required to enter an email address and pick and answer a security
question which will creates their password. The user has 3 attempts to answer
the question correctly

We will send you a one-off link that you can use to resume this form within 28 days. Email address We will only use this to send you a link to your form Pick a security question We will use this to verify your identity when you return What is your mother's maiden name? What is the last name of your favourite teacher? What is the name of the hospital where you were born? The answer to your security question Continue with saving Cancel saving and resume form

When the onetime link is used by clicking the link in their email, this will take users to their saved application.

To note

Should the user not complete and submit in any session, they will need to repeat the 'save for later' action each time. If they do not do this they will lose their draft and need to start the application again.

Once the save for later tool is used, the link that is emailed will be usable for 28 days before it expires. There is no recovery option if the user loses the link or forgets their security answer.

If changes to the form have been made between the user saving and returning to their draft application, they will be advised to and will be required to check all answers.

Users can save their progress on a form as many times as they like by generating a new link each time.

All user data is encrypted, stored securely and deleted after 28 days.

Once you have saved your application you will see the following screen
